**CALHOUN COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING**  
**April 21, 2020**

The meeting of the Calhoun County Commission was called to order on Tuesday, April 21, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. via Zoom. Present: Commissioners Helmick, Hicks and Westfall and County Clerk, Jean Simers. President Westfall led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Others present: Bill Bailey, Sheila Burch, Sheila Garretson, Horst Motz, John Nicholas, Eric Ritchie, Julie Sears, Phillip Taul and Marlin Zwohl

Commissioner Hicks moved and Commissioner Helmick seconded to approve the consent agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Phillip Taul addressed the Commission regarding Oka Road. He had emailed pictures of the condition of the road stating that needed services are basically shut off. There is approximately 10 houses with 30 people effected. The Commission will send a letter/proclamation to the Department of Highways and Mr. Taul will speak with them also.

Julie Sears, E911 Director, gave her monthly report with numbers being down for the month. When transporting someone they have to ask if they have a fever or cough or have been in contact with anyone being checked for COVID-19.

There was no Sheriff report or Home Confinement report.

Sheila Burch reported she has been in contact with several businesses. Some businesses have been successful in applying for the Payroll Protection Program before the money ran out.

Horst Motz spoke to the Commission regarding the ReConnect Grant. There will be a webinar meeting next week.

Commissioner Helmick moved and Commissioner Hicks seconded to approve the 2020-2021 budget/levy. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Hicks moved and Commissioner Helmick seconded to approve the WVCorp Insurance and Workers Compensation plans for the 2020-2021 year. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Hicks moved and Commissioner Helmick seconded to create a new fund for the COVID-19 \$100,000.00 grant. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Hicks moved and Commissioner Helmick seconded to approve the resignation of Ronda Rose. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Helmick moved and Commissioner Hicks seconded to approve the renewal of Samantha Wilson to the Calhoun County Library Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Hicks moved and Commissioner Helmick seconded to approve the renewal of Michele Smith to the Solid Waste Authority Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Hicks moved and Commissioner Helmick seconded to approve the resolution for Fair Housing Month. Motion carried unanimously.

The Commission received the fiduciary report for the quarter January – March 2020.

President Westfall also reported speaking with CEO Steve Whited from Minnie Hamilton Health System about the COVID-19 pandemic. They have completed approximately 100 tests and have enough equipment. Eric Ritchie from MHHS also reported that they review the status every day and are reaching out to vendors for testing supplies.

President Westfall adjourned the meeting at 10:00 a.m. with the next meeting scheduled for Monday, May 11, 2020 at 9:00 a.m.

House Bill 4524

By Delegates Westfall, Hartman, Sponaugle, Barrett, Phillips, Storch, Fiuaharty and Steele

[Introduced January 24, 2020; Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.]

A BILL to amend and reenact §60-5-1, §60-5-2, §60-5-3, §60-5-4, §60-5-5, §60-5-6 and §60-5-8 of the Code of West Virginia, 1931, as amended, all relating to making the entire state "wet" or permitting the sale of alcoholic liquors for off-premises consumption; providing a county option to vote to go "dry" or prohibit the sale of alcoholic liquors for off-premises consumption; and permitting an exception.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of West Virginia:

ARTICLE 5. LOCAL OPTION ELECTIONS.

§60-5-1. Election in county, magisterial district or municipality.

Effective July 1, 2020 the entire state shall be considered "wet" or permitting the sale of alcoholic liquors for off-premises consumption. A county is permitted, as set forth in this article, to vote to go "dry" or not permitting the sale of alcoholic liquors for off-premises consumption: Provided, That if that county votes to go "dry" the election does not affect any magisterial district or municipality that has voted on or before January 1, 2020 to be "wet." A county magisterial district or any municipality may, in an election held especially for the purpose, determine whether the sale of alcoholic liquors for beverage purposes shall be permitted off-premises consumption be prohibited within that county. ~~magisterial district or municipality~~

On or before June 1, 2020, the Commissioner of the Alcohol Beverage Control Administration shall send a certified letter to all political subdivisions which would be affected by the provisions of this bill. Such entities may stay "dry", that is, not permitting the sale of alcoholic liquors for off-premises consumption, if by August 1, 2020, a majority of the members of the respective county commission or city or town council shall vote to remain dry, and send a certified letter to the Commissioner of the Alcohol Beverage Control Administration, noting the results of such vote.

A local option election ~~shall~~ may not be held within 60 days of a general or municipal election.

§60-5-2. Election called on petition of five percent of qualified voters.

The county commission ~~or the governing body of the municipality, as the case may be~~ shall call a special "local option election" upon the filing of a petition signed by not less than five percent of the qualified voters within the county. ~~a magisterial district or municipality~~

§60-5-3. Form of petition.

The petition shall be in the following form:

§60-5-4. When election is to be held.

Elections must be held during the typical Primary or General elections; and shall not be held by a special election.

§60-5-5. Form of ballot.

On the ballot shall be printed the following:

Shall the sale of alcoholic ~~beverages~~ liquors for off-premises consumption under the West Virginia ~~liquor control commission be permitted~~ Alcohol Beverage Control Commissioner be prohibited in ..... County?

§60-5-6. How election conducted and results certified.

The ballots shall be counted, returns made and canvassed as in general elections, and the results certified by the commissioners of election to the county ~~court~~ commission of the county. ~~or the governing body of the municipality, as the case may be.~~ The county ~~court or governing body~~ commission shall without delay certify the result of the election to the ~~commission~~ Alcohol Beverage Control Commissioner.

§60-5-8. When another election may be held.

When a "local option election" has been held in a county ~~a magisterial district or municipality~~ another such election ~~shall~~ may not be held for a period of two years. ~~except that an election may be held within a municipality without regard to an election held in or the time limit applicable to the county within which the municipality, or a part thereof, is located~~

NOTE: The purpose of this bill is to make the entire state "wet" or permit the sale of alcoholic liquors (liquor, wine and beer over 15 percent abv) for off-premises consumption throughout the entire state. The bill does provide a county option if a county would want to vote to go dry or prohibit the sale of alcoholic liquors for off-premises consumption, but also permits an exception. There are currently 13 "dry" areas in the state, some as big as county, town or even tax districts.

Strike-throughs indicate language that would be stricken from a heading or the present law, and underscoring indicates new language that would be added.

Dear Commissioner Westfall,

The Mid-Ohio Valley Health Department (MOVHD) is very appreciative of our long and collaborative relationship with the Calhoun County Commission. The purpose of this letter is to request additional funding in the amount of \$4,265.00 to support unbudgeted expenses related to the Nationwide COVID-19 Pandemic. The Wood County Commission has committed an additional \$50,000 toward COVID-19 expenses which equates to \$.60 on a per capita basis by utilizing the July 1, 2019 population estimates. The requested amount from the Calhoun County Commission is calculated by this same formula.


As a Regional Public Health Department covering six counties, MOVHD Staff have been working overtime to perform regular duties in addition to the tasks required to manage the COVID-19 Pandemic. Here is a brief listing of those duties:

- Provide regional epidemiological support to the MOVHD EPI Region, Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the WVDHHR Division of Infectious Disease Epidemiology.
- Enhance public awareness by increasing public and media releases.
- Contact tracking, tracing and follow up of COVID-19 cases.
- Coordination and management of increased Environmental Health regulations and activities relating to COVID-19
- Coordination and management of increased Clinical activities including testing, contact tracking, tracing and follow-up of COVID-19 cases or suspected cases and their contacts.
- Additional assistance provided to the Clinical Director in the coordination and management of COVID-19 Clinical activities relating to COVID-19
- Administration, coordination and management of all COVID-19 actions for the entire MOVHD Region.
- Additional assistance provided to Executive Director in coordinating COVID-19 measures for the MOVHD region.
- Manage personnel issues relating to new and existing regulations for COVID-19.
- Management of Volunteers for clinics and other pandemic activities.
- Coordinate distribution of PPE (personal protection equipment).
- Provide support for COVID-19 activities including fiscal accountability, data management and West Virginia Public Health Alert System notifications.

Other expenses incurred in Calhoun County relate to the relocation of the Calhoun County office. Rent payments began March 1, 2020 however the final renovations and relocation to this office has been put on hold due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Staff are being paid mileage because they are required to travel to another County office to work.

In addition to extra spending related to the COVID-19 Pandemic, billable services have been reduced to a minimum resulting in less revenue. Please note that the amount requested above is a minimum amount and any monies contributed will be greatly appreciated.
